



Start of a New School Year

The season of autumn has begun which means students are settling into the new school year routine with new books, different teachers, and familiar faces. Holy Spirit is also kicking off a new year of religious education for children seeking the Sacrament of First Communion. Mrs. Elodia, pictured below, is the head organizer for religious education



at Holy Spirit and is seen reading aloud a passage from the bible. Last Monday was their second day of classes and the halls were once again alive with students running to find their rooms and prayers echoing the walls. Faith-based education for children is a fundamental element to growing in virtue and communion with God because we learn what it means to be Catholic from an early age. Children are like sponges and

they see and repeat what adults do so by living a more virtuous life, rooted in the teachings of the church, they can grow to becoming good and productive citizens. As role models of the faith, our instructors come equipped with the knowledge to answer your children's most pressing questions. One question that stood out to the program on Monday was, "Which person created God?" A student asked this while listening to the creation of Adam and Eve. Teachers observed how the room grew in silence as other students stopped their pencils to hear what the teacher would answer. The teacher replied, "First, God is not a person but a divine energy." The children would be taught about the trinity later but as it applied to the Book of Genesis, the teacher explained how God created the earth, the animals, and people, and in his infinite power he came into existence. Some of the students' faces changed into a state of understanding while others still looked puzzled— which is normal. Even if students still do not understand they are encouraged to continue coming to class because we all understand complex topics at our own pace. Questions like these truly make us stop and question our faith and even adults might wonder the same thing. We encourage children to ask what they do not understand so we can address a concern that they have or if their peers question the same thing.

Anything we cannot answer we then inquire with the priest. Questions also show curiosity and a childlike wonder to inquire more about the creator. This proves how their minds are already seeking to know more about God by trusting



in their instructors. We will continue to report the progress our kiddos make and in the meantime please pray for their journeys and the parents who bring them.

"The number of women who are beaten and abused in their homes." even by their husbands, is very, very high," Pope Francis said in answer to a question by a woman named Giovanna, a victim of domestic violence. REFLECT THROUGH THE GOSPEL

This weekend marks the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time and in the Gospel of Matthew we read about the parable of the two sons. A father who owned a vinyard instructed his two sons to work in it. The first son answered no and the second answered his father with yes. In the end the first son ended up doing his father's will while the second did not despite saying he would. Jesus asks the chief priests and elders which son did his father's will? They answered by saying the first son and Christ uses their answer to call out their hypocrasy. Jesus uses the first son to represent sinners like tax collectors and prostitutes who openly do not claim to live a virtuous life but repent and then believe in the word of God through the teachings of John the Baptist. The second son is meant to represent people who claim to live for God openly but do not follow his teachings such as the chief priests and elders. Although they claimed to live a rightous life they did not even believe John but tax collectors and prostitutes did. A person who proclaimes a virtuous life but does not act on it or believe in the Gospel is self-righouts and a hyprocite in the eyes of God. It is for this reason that Jesus says, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you." Jesus implies that if we say we live for God but do not follow his word then we are less then a tax collector or prostitute. For this reason we would have a less chance of entering heaven and living eternal life. We learn that by seeking reconcilation with God through the sacrament of confession, repenting with our hearts, and living out the word of God we can be on the road to salvation.



Matthew 21:28-32

Sexto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario y en el Evangelio de Mateo leemos sobre la parábola de los dos hijos. Un padre dueño de un viñedo ordenó a sus dos hijos que trabajaran en él. El primer hijo respondió que no y el segundo respondió a su padre que sí. Al final, el primer hijo acabó haciendo la voluntad de su padre mientras que el segundo no lo hizo a pesar de decir que así lo haría. Jesús pregunta a los principales sacerdotes y a los ancianos cuál hijo hizo la voluntad de su padre. Respondieron diciendo el primer hijo y Cristo usa su respuesta para denunciar su hipocresía. Jesús usa al primer hijo para representar a pecadores como recaudadores de impuestos y prostitutas que abiertamente no afirman vivir una vida virtuosa sino que se arrepienten y luego creen en la palabra de Dios a través de las enseñanzas de Juan el Bautista. El segundo hijo representa a personas que afirman vivir abiertamente para Dios pero que no siguen sus instrucciones, como los principales sacerdotes y los ancianos. Aunque afirmaban vivir una vida justa, ni siquiera le creyeron a Juan, pero sí los recaudadores de impuestos y las prostitutas. Una persona que proclama una vida virtuosa pero no actúa en consecuencia ni cree en el Evangelio es moralista e hipócrita a los ojos de Dios. Por esta razón, Jesús dice: "En verdad os digo que los publicanos y las prostitutas entran antes que vosotros en el reino de Dios". Jesús implica que si decimos que vivimos para Dios pero no seguimos su palabra, entonces somos menos que un recaudador de impuestos o una prostituta. Por esta razón, tendríamos menos posibilidades de entrar al cielo y vivir la vida eterna. Aprendemos que al buscar la reconciliación con Dios a través del sacramento de la confesión, arrepentirnos de corazón y vivir la palabra de Dios podemos estar en el camino hacia la salvación.
