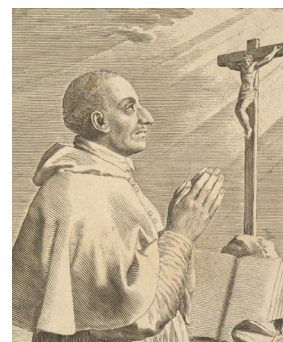

Do We Celebrate All Hallows?

Halloween is an unofficial holiday celebrated with candy, children in colorful costumes, and neighbors decorating their porches with carved pumpkins. We recognize that some people of faith do not celebrate it assuming that the holiday is associated with evil practices.

The Vatican News, the official news outlet reporting on the Global Catholic Church and the operations of the Holy See, included a statement made by Bishop David Konderla of Tulsa, Oklahoma that answers our questions about Halloween. Konderla states the necessity of, "maintaining the Catholic meaning and purpose of all holy days, especially those which have been adopted and adapted by the culture around us". He explains in his "Memorandum on the Celebration of Halloween" that dressing up and partaking in the holiday can be done in a Catholic spirit. He is correct given that Halloween is rooted in the Catholic faith because it is the vigil or "Eve" of "All Hallows" also known as All Saints Day celebrated on November 1. All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation and the day after is All Souls Day on Nov 2—a day we pray for the souls in purgatory and all our deceased loved ones.

Halloween is the beginning point of the conversation about death. It is our reminder to take death seriously, "So just as we commemorate the feast of All Saints on November 1st, beginning with All Hallows' Eve on Halloween, we also think about and turn our minds really, to the last things: death, judgment, heaven, and hell." says Konderla. Modern culture advertises characters like ghouls and ghosts because that is how the holiday is commercialized but for Catholics, it reminds us of the true meaning of Halloween which is to pray for the dead, "And really our focus should be, since we all must die and are destined to judgment, how then we to live?" Konderla emphasizes here that this three-day celebration is meant to refocus our attention on living a virtuous life to avoid suffering after death.

Remembering Lorraine

"She became friends ANYWHERE AND EVERYWHERE. She was a naturally loving person and NEVER met a stranger." These are some of the many characteristics that describe our former parishioner Lorraine Mary Bergeron-Moss. Lorraine was born on November 28, 1935, and passed away on the Feast Day of Guardian Angels on October 2, 2023. Her love for life was best shown through her service to others as she helped hundreds of people over the years by "answering questions, finding jobs, lending money, sponsoring events, donating her time, making dinners, dancing, laughing with and loving everyone she met."

It is for this reason that Lorraine was said to have 4,000 children in addition to her four biological children Lori, Kenneth, Bernadette, and Stephan. "She invited many people to her home where she welcomed them as her family. She 'adopted' and 'raised' many children over the years especially after one or more of their parents passed away-".

She remained a devoted Christian servant not just in her personal life but also at Holy Spirit. Her true calling was working as a church secretary and she worked on church affairs and festivals for Holy Spirit from 1993-2004. She was a member of our parish community for over 33 years and worked with Msgr. Lechner, Deacon Marvin, and others. Thank you Lorraine for all you have done and all that you were! ¿Celebramos Halloween?

Halloween es una festividad no oficial que se celebra con dulces, niños con disfraces coloridos y vecinos decorando sus porches con calabazas talladas. Reconocemos que algunas personas de fe no lo celebran asumiendo que la festividad está asociada con prácticas malvadas.

The Vatican News, el medio oficial de noticias que informa sobre la Iglesia Católica Mundial y las operaciones de la Santa Sede, incluyó una declaración hecha por el obispo David Konderla de Tulsa, Oklahoma, que responde a nuestras preguntas sobre Halloween. Konderla afirma la necesidad de “mantener el significado y propósito católico de todos los días santos, especialmente aquellos que han sido adoptados y adaptados por la cultura que nos rodea”. Explica en su “Memorando sobre la celebración de Halloween” que disfrazarse y participar en la festividad se puede hacer con un espíritu católico. Tiene razón dado que Halloween tiene sus raíces en la fe católica porque es la vigilia o “Víspera” de “Todos los Santos”, también conocido como Día de Todos los Santos, que se celebra el 1 de noviembre. El Día de Todos los Santos es un día santo de precepto y el día siguiente es el Día de Todos los Difuntos el 2 de noviembre, un día en el que oramos por las almas del purgatorio y por todos nuestros seres queridos fallecidos.

Halloween es el punto de partida de la conversación sobre la muerte. Es nuestro recordatorio de tomar en serio la muerte: “Así como conmemoramos la fiesta de Todos los Santos el 1 de noviembre, comenzando con la víspera de Todos los Santos en Halloween, también pensamos y dirigimos nuestra mente a las últimas cosas: la muerte, juicio, cielo e infierno”. dice Konderla. La cultura moderna anuncia personajes como demonios y fantasmas porque así es como se comercializa la festividad, pero para los católicos, nos recuerda el verdadero significado de Halloween, que es orar por los muertos: “Y realmente nuestro enfoque debería ser, ya que todos debemos morir”. y estamos destinados al juicio, ¿cómo entonces viviremos?” Konderla enfatiza aquí que esta celebración de tres días tiene como objetivo volver a centrar nuestra atención en vivir una vida virtuosa para evitar el sufrimiento después de la muerte.

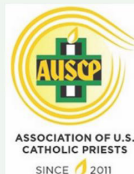

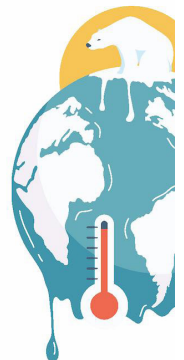
