5. On the large bead, meditate on the first mystery and pray the Our Father.
6. Pray a Hail Mary on each of the 10 smaller beads.
7. On the chain before the next decade, pray the Glory Be & The Fatima Prayer.
8. Repeat each decade (steps 5, 6 & 7) starting with the Our Father until you reach the medal in the center.
9. Finish by praying the Hail, Holy Queen and closing prayer.

“A small group of teenagers and young adults, and those young at heart who embarked on a journey of a lifetime, this past summer.”



“We interacted with hundreds of other countries and more than 1 million other Catholics from around the world. As we proclaimed our faith for the world to see and to proclaim our love to God and see the Pope and chanting this is the youth of the pope that we are the church had made it all worth it and made us realize why we worked so hard to get there.”



“Hopefully, we will be able to send some youth to Rome in 2025 for the grand Jubilee and South Korea in 2027 for the next World Youth Day. In which we are able to foster the faith of our youth for a lifetime.”

“It was a challenge where we were tested physically mentally emotionally and spiritually, but hopefully, we became



“It was an unforgettable experience. I saw SO many people from different countries chant, sing, dance, pray, and worship our God. I was at one point at least 7 feet away from the Pope! I can't describe how it felt to see him. It was amazing. I enjoyed the food of Portugal and the people I met. I will forever have the memories of World Youth Day through pictures and gifts that were given to me.”



“There was something so beautiful about being surrounded by so many Catholics saying the same prayer in so many languages. We went twice one for every night we stayed in the town of Fatima. It was also beautiful to see a handful of our teens doing a ‘Manda’ (a vow to a saint whose assistance is sought because he or she specializes in a specific cause or miracle) to the la Virgin de Fatima. Where they went on their knees crawling to the Virgin asking for her to intercede for them to their prayers to God as they asked for the health, and peace for their families, and themselves.”

“Our trip to Fatima came towards the end of our trip in Portugal and it marked for us the end of a trip of a lifetime. It was extra special knowing that days before we arrived there was a miracle of a young 16 year old Jimena who gained her sight back after losing her vision and being classed as being legally blind. For you could still feel the miracle in the air. Every night everyone would gather at 9pm with their candles and rosaries where we will hold a vigil for our lady. The rosary while started by the priests who were there was ultimately led by people from around the world. Where each decade of the rosary was in a different language that was represented by the people present.”
