

Gaudete Sunday

This Sunday we light the pink candle in our wreath and celebrate the Third Sunday in Advent. Pink is the liturgical color signifying joy and this candle is called the "Shepard's Candle". It takes us back in time to the same joy the shepherds experienced on their way to see Jesus in Bethlehem. One night shepards were watching over their flock as an angel appeared to them and this encounter is noted in Luke 2:8-14, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." The shepherds were terrified at first because they came in contact with a divine messenger not of this world. Their terror turned to trust and happiness as they understood that the good news was Jesus. What better joy than to meet someone you have longed to see? The Messiah is the most awaited person since his coming means the end of eternal death. He brought love and light into the world filled with sin and excuses for sin. Christ, as a beakon of light, is the reason we light each candle with anticipation and remind ourselves that life is dark without his unconditional love. Seeking and nuturing a relationship with him is how we come to know this love. The joy the shepherds felt that night is the same joy we feel as December 25 draws closer. This Sunday or "Gaudete Sunday", as the church calls it, also means praise or rejoice so let us rejoice as the birth of Christ is almost upon us!





The diocese's annual Filipino holiday tradition of Simbang Gabi will begin with a special vigil Mass on Dec. 14 at 6:30 p.m. at St. Michael Church in San Diego. Everyone is welcome!

Simbang Gabi (Filipino for "Night Masses") is a novena of Masses to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as she awaits the birth of the Son.

On Dec. 14, the evening will begin with a procession of "parols," colorful star-shaped lanterns that remind the faithful that Jesus is the "Light of the World." Afterward, there will be a rosary followed by Mass by candlelight, to be celebrated by Cardinal McElroy. Beginning Dec. 15, Simbang Gabi services will be held in parishes across the diocese at varying times.
