


# PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

### **Three Wise Kings**



This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord—the day the Three Wise Kings visited baby Jesus. The word epiphany derives from the Greek word "epiphainen", meaning "to shine upon." The Three Wise Kings or Magi were said to have traveled from the east by way of a

bright star, "And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother." (Matt 2:10-11). The star shined just as brightly as Jesus's coming impacted the way mankind would now be saved from eternal death. What is even more inspiring is that the savior began his journey in the most humbling ways and as a baby. God strived to unite himself to us, to the point of sending his only son to live among his children and feel both human and divine. How beautiful and confusing is that? Jesus is a beacon light because he is the hope we need to get through our days and what better person to form a relationship with and love then someone who understands us best. Sin keeps us from expanding that relationship and although there are different types of sin from venial to mortal, all sin hurts us. All sin hurts God. 
