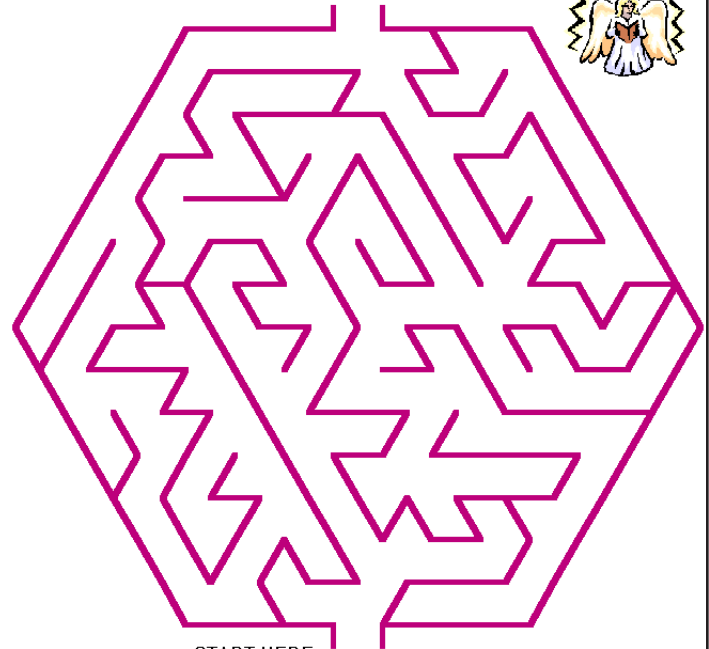

SAINTS FUN FACTS

by John Sheppard

St. Katherine Drexel was born in Philadelphia in 1858. She took an avid interest in the well being of black and native Americans. She began by donating money but soon realized more was necessary.

She founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Black and Native American peoples, dedicating her life and fortune of \$20 million to this work.

She opened the first mission school for Indians and many others for blacks in the south. She founded Xavier University in New Orleans.

Katherine became only the 2nd recognized American born saint in 2000.

REFLECTION WITH FATHER REMY

How Does The First Commandment Apply In An Era Of Increasing Secularism And Religious Pluralism?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church interprets the commandment “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy” with a particular focus on Sunday, the Lord’s Day, which is considered the day of Christ’s Resurrection. This change from the Jewish Sabbath to the Christian Sunday reflects the new creation inaugurated by the Resurrection of Jesus. Sunday is, therefore, seen as the primary day of celebration and worship in the Christian tradition, replacing the Sabbath of the Old Testament. The faithful are called to participate in Sunday Mass, the heart of Christian practice and a testimony of fidelity to Christ and the Church. Participation in the Sunday Eucharist is considered mandatory unless there are serious reasons for absence, such as severe illness or caring for babies. Deliberately missing Sunday Mass without a serious reason is regarded as a severe sin.

The Catechism also emphasizes the importance of rest and leisure on Sundays, allowing the faithful to cultivate their family, cultural, social, and religious lives. It is recommended that work and activities that impede the worship of God, the joy of the Lord’s Day, and adequate rest are avoided. Sunday is also a day for good works and humble service, particularly for those in need.



In his book *Creation*, Ratzinger demonstrated that God created the universe to enter a love story with humanity (p. 30). In his writings, Ratzinger often describes God as a communion of love, eternally existing as a Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This communion of love is expansive and creative and not closed in on itself. The creation of the universe is an act of love, an overflow of this trinitarian love that desires to share its goodness and beauty with another, in this case, creation and, more specifically, humanity. For Ratzinger, the result of the universe is neither an accident nor a necessity but a free and generous act of love. God does not need creation to be God; He chooses to create to share the joy of His love and life. Humanity, formed in the image and likeness of God, occupies a special place in this creation, destined to live in a relationship with God, reflecting the loving communion of the Trinity.

Ratzinger states regarding the Lord’s Day: whoever deduces from this fact that the spiritual meaning of the Sabbath is opposite to that of Sunday has radically understood both the Old Testament and the New Testament. This statement about the spiritual meaning of Saturday and Sunday addresses a deep and integrated understanding of the Old and New Testaments in the Christian tradition. A more holistic experience of Scripture and the Church’s liturgical practice refutes the idea that Saturday and Sunday have opposing spiritual meanings. Sunday, as the first day of the week, is identified with the first day of creation and, simultaneously, as the “eighth day”, symbolizing the new creation inaugurated by the Resurrection of Christ. Since the times of the Apostles, the Church has celebrated the Eucharist on the first day of the week, marking it as the day of Christian celebration par excellence. Ratzinger’s understanding, therefore, highlights that the Christian Sunday brings to fullness the spiritual meaning of the Jewish Sabbath. The celebration of Sunday, with its emphasis on the Resurrection and new creation, is not contrary to the spirit of the Sabbath but is its fulfillment and fulfillment in God’s saving plan. This vision reflects continuity and fulfillment of divine promises, uniting the Old and New Testaments in a single narrative of salvation.

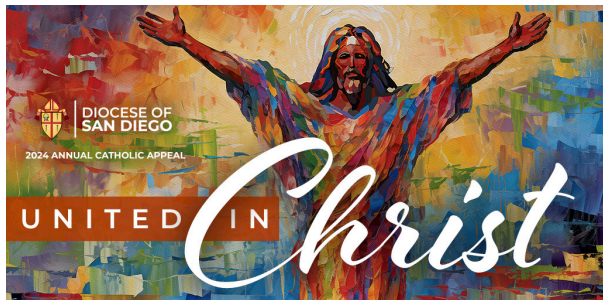
To answer the question: How does this specific reading deepen your appreciation for the meaning of this commandment? It can be said that the celebration of Sunday as the primary day of worship and rest highlights the importance of the Christian community coming together to celebrate the Eucharist, which strengthens the bonds of faith and charity among the faithful. Sunday, as the Lord’s Day, places the Resurrection of Christ at the center of Christian life and worship. This emphasizes victory over sin and death and hope in eternal life, foundations of the Christian faith. By dedicating Sunday to rest and worship, we are reminded of the need for balance in life, making time for spiritual renewal, which reflects God’s rest after creation.

Finally, as presented in these readings, the theological and spiritual understanding of Sunday enriches the appreciation of the commandment by showing its depth, its rootedness in the history of salvation, and its relevance for contemporary Christian life.

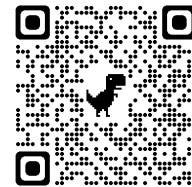

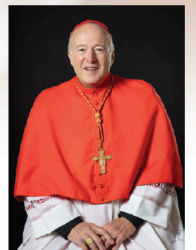
